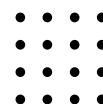


OUR MISSION

The Neuro-Oncology Family of Journals



Our flagship publication, *Neuro-Oncology*, led by Editor in Chief Susan Chang, received an impact factor of 13.4 in the most recent edition of the Journal Citation Reports. SNO congratulates Editor-in-Chief Susan Chang and the past and present editorial teams for their outstanding work, which impressively ranks our journal 4th out of 285 Clinical Neurology titles and 20th out of 326 titles in the Oncology category.

Neuro-Oncology's sister title, *Neuro-Oncology Advances*, published in partnership with the European Association of Neuro-Oncology, recorded an impact factor of 4.1. SNO is indebted to founding Editor in Chief Gelareh Zadeh and her entire editorial team for this significant accomplishment. As SNO's first fully Open Access title, *Neuro-Oncology Advances* ensures that the Society remains on the cutting edge of academic publishing.

Neuro-Oncology Practice, also published in partnership with EANO, was assigned a very respectable impact factor score of 2.5. *Neuro-Oncology Practice* provides an important platform for the dissemination of applied and practical education in the field, and Editor-in-Chief Martin Taphoorn and his editorial team are to be commended for their strong work.



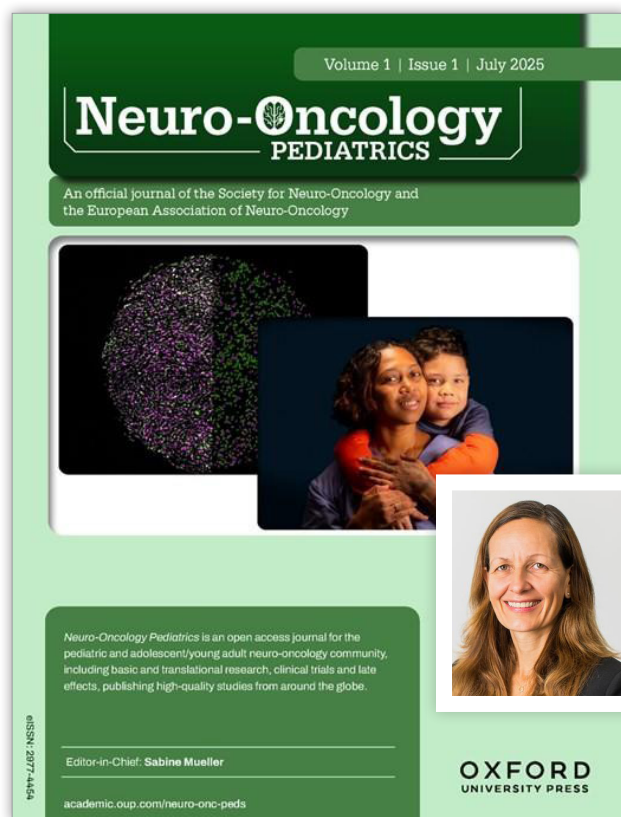
Fourth Journal Announced: *Neuro-Oncology Pediatrics*



SNO is pleased to report that *Neuro-Oncology Pediatrics* officially began publication in June of 2025 as the fourth title in the Neuro-Oncology family of journals. Serving as the inaugural Editor-in-Chief is Sabine Mueller.

Jointly owned by SNO and EANO, this new journal provides a multidisciplinary forum for the dissemination of basic science, translational research, and clinical trial findings on the topic of pediatric neuro-oncology. Bringing forward a new journal is no small task and is many years in the making, and SNO would like to recognize Tracy Batchelor, Susan Short, Phil Bishop and Chas Haynes, for their vision and leadership to make this new title possible.

SNO thanks to the Pediatric Brain Tumor Foundation for their financial support of the new journal. Members of SNO may recall that the PBTf provided seed-funding for the launch of *Neuro-Oncology* over 25 years ago, and their continued support of our Society is deeply appreciated.

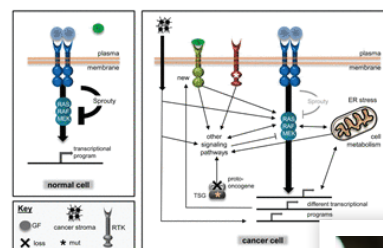

Celebrating 30 Years of Progress

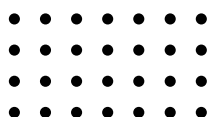


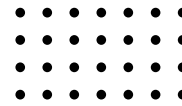
- A special panel reflecting on the key accomplishments from SNO's 30-year history was held during the Annual Meeting in Honolulu.

This year, the Society for Neuro-Oncology commemorated three decades of dedication, innovation, and collaboration in advancing the care of patients with brain tumors. Since its founding in 1994, SNO has served as a beacon of progress for patients, families, clinicians, and researchers—fostering groundbreaking science, elevating multidisciplinary education, and strengthening partnerships across the neuro-oncology community.

Over the past thirty years, SNO has grown from humble beginnings into a dynamic global leader in the field. We have launched high-impact journals, published consensus guidelines, nurtured the next generation of investigators, forged international collaborations, and shaped the future of neuro-oncology through scientific discovery and education. Each milestone reflects the enduring commitment of our members and the strong foundation built by those who came before us.

From November 17–23, 2025, we celebrated our past, present, and future at the 30th Annual Scientific Meeting in Honolulu, Hawaii. Special commemorative activities included a plenary session reflecting on SNO's evolution; a video-wall installation highlighting all past presidents and key historical milestones; member-submitted video messages; and the launch of a dedicated 30th-anniversary website. Together, these moments honored our history while inspiring the next chapter of SNO's impact.

Initial Vision & Bylaws

Victor Levin articulated a vision of an organization that would promote multidisciplinary interactions and provide balanced representation for all specialties interested in advancing research and treatment of neurological malignancies. The effort was formalized with bylaws developed with the input of Jay Loeffler and the assistance of Jan Esenwein and Linda Greer.

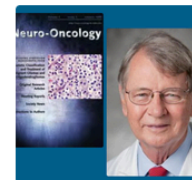

Annual Scientific Meeting & Education Day

The Quadrennial Meeting of the World Federation of Neuro-Oncology Societies (WFNOS), held in conjunction with the 30th Society for Neuro-Oncology (SNO) Annual Meeting & Education Day.

This year, SNO was honored to host the 7th Quadrennial Meeting of the World Federation of Neuro-Oncology Societies (WFNOS), which was held in conjunction with the Society's 30th Annual Meeting & Education Day, in beautiful Honolulu, Hawaii.

The WFNOS is a global collaborative platform uniting neuro-oncology societies across continents to accelerate advances in research, education, and clinical care of central nervous system tumors. As a truly international event, the educational program was developed with scientific representing our sister societies, including the Asian Society for Neuro-Oncology, the European Association of Neuro-Oncology, the Society for Neuro-Oncology in Latin America, and the Society for Neuro-Oncology in Sub-Saharan Africa.

The conference set new records for abstract submissions, overall attendance, and the number of countries represented. The event opened with an Education Day featuring two dedicated tracks that explored international models of neuro-oncologic care and the latest advances in brain tumor technologies. The main scientific program included outstanding keynote lectures and plenary sessions, 26 concurrent sessions on a broad range of cutting-edge topics, two lunchtime poster sessions, high-impact abstract presentations, and over 1600 scientific posters. To ensure truly global participation, sessions were supported by simultaneous interpretation into more than 60 languages, reinforcing the meeting's commitment to inclusive, worldwide engagement.
